## **FCDOT** Introduction

First Fairfax County Transit Development Plan completed in 2009 for FY2011 - FY2020

- DRPT requires a TDP update every 6 years
- FCDOT is developing two documents
  - Ten-year Comprehensive Transit Plan (CTP)
  - Six-year Transit Development Plan (TDP) Update

## Purpose of the CTP and TDP

#### **▶**CTP


- Compare current bus service to travel patterns and needs
- Recommend service and facility adjustments to meet ten year demand
- Prioritized plan for needed bus service and facility improvements from FY2016 – FY2025 – fiscally unconstrained

### **▶**TDP

- DRPT requirement six year financially constrained plan
- Blueprint for bus service and related capital improvements from FY2016 through FY2021 – constrained to anticipated revenues



## **CTP Project Scope - Service Recommendations**

- Analysis of current and potential ridership
- Development of plans for bus service improvements, such as:
  - Improved Metro feeders
  - Cross-County routes
  - Connections to nearby jurisdictions
  - Adjusted frequency and hours of service
  - Silver Line Phase 2 bus plan





# **Project Schedule**

Task	Timeline
Data Gathering	Mostly complete; North County surveys and ridership counts on hold until Silver Line changes are in place
Phase I General Public Outreach:  Provide Input	September – October (after Silver Line opening)
Service Planning	October – March
Phase 2 General Public Outreach: Review Recommendations	Spring 2015
Finalize CTP	Fall 2015
TDP Update for Board Approval	Fall 2015



# **Approach to Public Outreach**

- Two phases of outreach
- County Supervisor briefings fall 2013 & spring 2015
- Briefings for County boards and local officials

  - fall 2014 & spring 2015
    - Online engagement: County website and IdeaScale
    - Pop-ups at public events
    - General public workshops
    - Meetings with community based organizations
- Consideration of minority, low income and LEP populations
