

Special Permit Amendment Overview

- 1) Standard five-year renewal
- 2) North Pit reclamation



- Reserves exist in the North Pit; production mining has ceased
- Cannot leave quarry "as is" by law and for safety reasons
- DMME requires restoration of quarry properties
- Reclamation is the last stage of the mining process
- Reclamation is not the end use of the property



Four Goals:

- 1) To exceed DMME requirements
- 2) Environmentally sensitive
- 3) Protect groundwater resources
- 4) Serves as model for future reclamation plans elsewhere



Reclamation Plan governs all aspects of quarry restoration

- Removal of equipment
- Removal of aggregate stockpiles
- Removal of structures
- Restoration of quarry with clean dirt
- Environmental protocols
- Safety improvements (smoothing edges, perimeter fence)
- Revegetation with trees, grasses
- Construction of lake



Reclamation Plan governs all aspects of quarry restoration

- The classification of material to be placed
- The source of said material
- Screening, sampling, and testing protocols
- Material placement and compaction
- Site access and maintenance
- Groundwater monitoring protocols



Reclamation Plan governs all aspects of quarry restoration

- Inspection of fill generation sites
- Reporting procedures
- Chain of custody protocols
- Grading plans
- Soil and chemical testing requirements
- Soil submittal and approval processes
- Record keeping, and more.



Reclamation Plan submitted to County in July 2019



County engaged third-party consultant (Arcadis)



Arcadis provides comments in May 2020



Luck Stone responds to Arcadis comments in June 2020



- Post reclamation, the site is suitable for future use
- Any future use would require public hearings/special permit amendment
- Not a landfill
- Water impoundment not an option
- South pit reclamation



- Is Luck Stone proposing a change in use from a quarry or water reservoir to a landfill?
- Is Luck Stone obligated to import this level of Reclamation Fill?
- Why can't this just be a deep lake, as was contemplated with the reservoir?
- What amount of Reclamation Fill will be placed in the pits?
- Is there a time estimate as to how long it will take to complete the reclamation?



- What will the site look like?
- Water elevation be? How deep?
- Will there be any recreational opportunities?

Conceptual Renderings







- What is "Reclamation Fill"? What is the definition of "dirt" and "rock"? There needs to be a technical definition on the plans.
- What will Reclamation Fill be tested for?
- How will Luck Stone verify the quality and content of Reclamation Material?
- Will there be a screening or testing of each load?
- Who will evaluate what is in the dirt and how will that person/entity be selected?
- Will there be random sampling? Ongoing monitoring?



- Who is responsible for the chain of custody of materials and ensuring no one is tampering with them between the source and the quarry?
- How will Luck Stone ensure rouge truck drivers aren't sneaking in unpermitted materials?
- What records will Luck Stone keep regarding testing and placement and will they be provided to Fairfax County for verification?



- What impact will Reclamation have on local traffic?
- Please address concerns that trucks exiting the quarry site are tracking mud, gravel, and dust onto Lee Highway.
- Does Luck Stone instruct drivers leaving the quarry to refrain from using Bull Run Post Office Road or Pleasant Valley Road?
- Can we reestablish the "Friends of the Quarry" citizen liaison group which used to meet semiannually?
