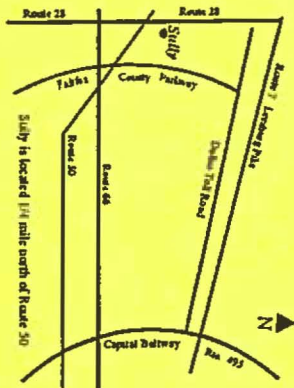
Regular guided tours: \$7/adult, \$6/student, \$5/senior & child.

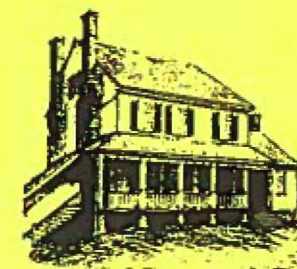
