Since Last Presentation in 2018...

- Incidents fell 10% due to COVID lockdowns, but returning to normal
 - Incidents in CY18 = 109,250
 - Incidents in CY19 = 111,261
 - Incidents in CY20 = 100,257
 - CY21 on track for 111k+
- Ongoing Challenges
 - Urbanization and density
 - Traffic congestion
 - Aging facilities and capital equipment

Accomplishments and Milestones

- Partnered with health department on COVID-19 vaccination rollout agencywide and in the community
- Created 8th Battalion and 2nd 24-hr Deputy Chief for all three shifts
- August 2021 opened Scotts Run Fire Station 44, first station funded through public–private partnership

- Implemented FACT*R to deliver blood via 911 resources to trauma patients; 2020 Governor Fire Service Award
- Developed internal Patient Outcomes Dashboard for all INOVA patients to improve quality assurance
- Expanding Community Risk Reduction Program
- Year to Date 4,301 Life Years Added




Sully District

Incident Activity: Heat Maps



Improving Response Times

- Working towards improving response times through emergency vehicle preemption
- About 20% of the signals in Fairfax county have traffic preemption

Sully District: EVP

- Approximately120 Signals
- 10-15% with preemption devices (infrared, GPS, or fire house button)
