




To Protect the Health and Wealth of our Environment

The Purpose

The Fairfax County Septic Consortium has been formed to work with the Fairfax County Health Department - Division of Environmental Health (FCHD-DEH) to consider the development of new regulations regarding the management and operation of 'onsite' wastewater systems. These systems are commonly referred to as septic systems and are recognized as a permanent part of the County infrastructure.

There are approximately 30,000 of these septic system located in the areas in red shown on the map.



As a homeowner, you are responsible for monitoring and maintaining your septic system and ensuring it is functioning satisfactorily. Advancements in septic systems and 'onsite' wastewater treatment technology have resulted in highly complicated treatment and pumping systems possibly making your job extremely complicate. Therefore, the Fairfax County Septic Consortium wants to help you.....

To Protect Your Health

"Out of sight and out of mind" is what happens in most cases with septic systems until problems occur. However, failing septic systems are more than a nuisance; they can be a health hazard. Industry experts agree that ongoing maintenance is necessary.



To Protect Your Wealth

A septic system is a critical component of a home's value. A failing septic system can be bad news for the homeowner's bank account as replacement of these systems can range from \$25,000 - \$40,000. Similar to any mechanical device, routine attention is the best approach to assure a long and healthy service life of the septic system.

<u>To Protect the Health & Wealth</u> of Our Environment

Wastewater treated by septic systems flows into our environment. If these septic systems fail, there is the potential to pollute groundwater, streams, and open water bodies. Ultimately, this can impact the quality of our drinking water.
